Polk County Supervisor of Elections Lori Edwards is conceding to the Florida Department of State on partisan elections after the agency threatened legal action in a recent letter.

Edwards, a former Democratic state House member, had previously refused to hold partisan races for some local seats, including her own, but reversed course recently, after the top lawyer for the state elections authority wrote to Edwards.

The Florida Department of State "will be forced to bring an action to enforce the performance of your duties in accordance with the Florida Election Code," wrote Joseph Van de Bogart, general counsel at the agency.

In a brief response, Edwards agreed to conduct partisan contests for the seats at issue.

"I'm glad the issue is resolved," Edwards told Florida Politics on Monday. "I am happy to comply with the Secretary of State's directive."

WHO IS THE PRIME MONITOR **OF CITIZEN RIGHTS:** THE FEDERAL OR STATE GOVERNMENT?

7 Thile watching the Republican debate last month, one point stated V during the curve balls of the candidates hit me like a toothache: the return of the issue of abortion back to the states. My reaction was: if a "right" belongs to each citizen, then the same right belongs to all citizens and has no state boundaries. The prime guardian and guarantor of human rights for all Americans needs to be the federal government, not the state governments.

The Constitution of the United States guarantees certain enumerated rights to all Americans and acknowledges unenumerated rights (whose existences are not always easy to historically prove in the courts or with legislative bodies). From the beginning of the United States, it was the states that played a major part of determining the rights of their respective citizens — not always for the better

— while the federal government played a minor role, especially during the pre-Civil War period.

Since the 1790's, the three branches of federal and state governments have each determined the parameters of how we live and behave in our everyday lives — one branch stepping forward to make formal and legal promulgations on behalf of the citizenry when the situation arises.



While Congress enacts laws, the president issues executive orders and the Supreme Court hands down decisions, each branch can also reverse or kill their own decisions. Executive orders are only in force during the term of a current president. A new president may keep, kill or modify any orders of his/her predecessor. The administrative agencies also have power to make rules, enforce them and interpret them (the famous "deep state").

To place the oversight of citizen rights into the hands of the federal government is not to belittle or deny the role of individual states in protecting the rights of their respective citizens. The Constitution provides for such rights and duties. Acknowledg-


ing that the federal government has not always exhibited an unblemished record in protecting and respecting the basic rights of all Americans, the same may be said for individual states.

The reversal of Roe v. Wade is a good example of handing over to the states the "right of the people" to make choices as to what should be law governing abortion (or other issues) is somewhat a joke. Polls may show what the "people" want, but it is the legislatures and governors who have the last say in the passage of laws and the judiciary to state the constitutionality of the laws.

The history of the past is a witness to the dark side of human behavior that made life miserable or ended for so many minority groups. I still remember the federal elections when States' Rights parties garnered many votes, especially during the presidential candidacy of George Wallace as a representative of the "Old South."

My concern today is if a "right" is essential to human existence, then it is the prime role of the federal government to protect that "right" across the county – no state boundaries with a hodge-podge of crazy laws and no intrusions into the private lives of citizens.

This year celebrates the 60th anniversary of the Civil Rights March On Washington. Thank you, Dr. King, and to those who helped organize the 1963 and 2023 marches.




